Frequently Asked Questions and Answers About Measure AA

Q: What is Measure AA?

A: On August 8, 2018, the Wildomar City Council unanimously placed Measure AA on the November 6, 2018 ballot. If approved, Measure AA would provide local funds for Wildomar's public safety and other city services. Measure AA is a one-cent transaction and use tax (sales tax). Wildomar doesn't have enough fire stations, firefighters and paramedics. If approved, Measure AA would provide funding for Wildomar's police, fire, 911 response times as well as repair and maintain streets and roads, and other city services.

Q: What public safety services can Measure AA fund?

A: If approved, Measure AA may fund public safety and other city services, including:

- Maintaining and Improving local police/fire protection
- Maintaining and local streets, roads and potholes
- Preserving 911 medical response times
- Addressing Homelessness

Q: Can Measure AA fund firefighters?

A: Yes, Measure AA can upgrade the only current city fire station as well as add additional firefighters and paramedics.

Q: Can Sacramento take Measure AA money?

A: No, Measure AA provides local funds to be used by Wildomar for public safety and other city services. Since over the last six years Sacramento has withheld over \$12,500,000 from the City of Wildomar, Measure AA provides local control over City funding and needs.

Q: What are Measure AA's fiscal accountability protections?

A: Measure AA provides for independent financial audits and citizens oversight to ensure that funds are spent properly.
